

Mastercard Cybersecurity Incentive Program (CSIP)

Overview



The Mastercard Cybersecurity Incentive Program (CSIP) provides eligible merchants using EMV technology, a Payment Card Industry Security Standards Council (PCI SSC)-listed solution, or a suite of cybersecurity and risk management tools increased flexibility within [Site Data Protection \(SDP\) Program](#) Standards. The CSIP is a component of the SDP Program and is optional for merchants. The CSIP incentivizes merchant participation by either reducing PCI Data Security Standard (DSS) compliance validation requirements or by eliminating the requirement to annually validate compliance with the PCI DSS through the following programs:

- Risk-based Approach
- Validation Exemption Program (VEP)
- Compliance and Validation Exemption Program (C-VEP)

CSIP Options



01 Risk-based Approach

A qualifying [Level 1 or 2 merchant](#) located outside of the U.S. Region may use the Risk-based Approach, which **reduces** a merchant's compliance requirements to validating compliance with only the first two of the six total milestones set forth in [The Prioritized Approach to Pursue PCI DSS Compliance](#).

02 Validation Exemption Program (VEP)

A qualifying [Level 1, 2, 3, or 4 merchant](#) in all Regions using approved secure technologies such as EMV chip technology, a PCI-listed point-to-point encryption (P2PE) solution, a mobile point-of-sale (MPOS) EMV acceptance solution, or EMV payment tokenization may participate in VEP. VEP **exempts** a merchant from annually validating its compliance with the PCI DSS.

03 Compliance and Validation Exemption Program (C-VEP)

A qualifying [Level 3 or 4 merchant](#) in all Regions that integrates a comprehensive suite of cybersecurity and risk management tools into their environment through their acquirer may participate in C-VEP. C-VEP **exempts** a merchant from the requirement to comply with the PCI DSS and annually validate their compliance with the PCI DSS to Mastercard.
